#### Collect

#### First Reading: Malachi 3: 1-5

See, I am sending my messenger to prepare the way before me, and the Lord whom you seek will suddenly come to his temple. The messenger of the covenant in whom you delight - indeed, he is coming, says the Lord of hosts. But who can endure the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?

For he is like a refiner's fire and like fullers' soap; he will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver, and he will purify the descendants of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, until they present offerings to the Lord in righteousness. Then the offering of Judah and Jerusalem will be pleasing to the Lord as in the days of old and as in former years. Then I will draw near to you for judgement; I will be swift to bear witness against the sorcerers, against the adulterers, against those who swear falsely, against those who oppress the hired workers in their wages, the widow, and the orphan, against those who thrust aside the alien, and do not fear me, says the Lord of hosts.

#### Psalm 24: 7-end.

Lift up your heads, O gates! and be lifted up, O ancient doors! that the King of glory may come in.

Who is the King of glory?

The Lord, strong and mighty, the Lord, mighty in battle. Lift up your heads, O gates! and be lifted up, O ancient doors! that the King of glory may come in.

Who is this King of glory?
The Lord of hosts, he is the King of glory.

### Second Reading: Hebrews 2: 14-end.

Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. Therefore, he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

#### Holy Gospel: Luke 2: 22-40

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.' Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law. Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, 'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too.' There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.



## Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme to be extended

It was announced in the House of Commons Westminster Hall debate on Wednesday (22 January 2025) that the Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme will continue for another 12 months from March 2025, with a cap of £25k per place of worship. Furthermore, the total amount available will be capped at £23m. For comparison, £29m was spent last year. The announcement was summarised in a ministerial written statement. Adam Klups, Care of Churches and DAC Team Lead said: "There was a realistic prospect of the scheme being scrapped, therefore the outcome is to be celebrated.

"Yet, the news will be disappointing for churches planning for larger projects as the cap is likely to affect their fundraising needs.

"I want to thank our parishioners and clergy who wrote to their MP and the Secretary of State for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) in support of the scheme. Your help and determination have paid off. The DCMS received more than three hundred letters on the topic, and some three thousand letters were sent to MPs.

"The advice we are giving to parishes is to submit any eligible claims by the end of this financial year, to maximise the grant amount available to them in the next financial year.

"The National Church, Gloucester DAC and other partners will continue to engage with the government on this important issue."



### Tyndale Trail

There are many connections to William Tyndale in our area, and we are hoping to make these facts more available and accessible as part of a Tyndale Trail. This will help highlight some of our historic churches, provide opportunities for people to encounter a faith-filled story in faith-filled places, and provide an opportunity for those people to support those historic buildings financially.

This is part of our deanery strategic plan: to make the best use of our current assets, of which our historic church buildings are a significant part.

We already have some data, made some connections with The Bible Society and The Tyndale Society, and have an enthusiast who has put in some groundwork. The next step is to hold a gathering of interested people to review what we have,

hear some different voices and perspectives, and work out our next steps. This meeting is taking place on 25th March at 10am. Venue to be confirmed.
