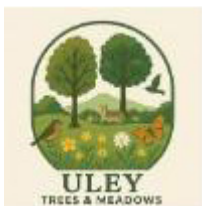

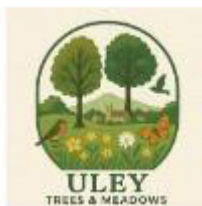

Uley School Nursery

Here is a reminder and update regarding the plans for a village nursery at Uley School.

In October 2025, Uley Primary School opened its doors and successfully welcomed pre-school children from the age of 3 years old. During this time the government released Phase 2 of the School-based Nursery Capital Grant Application. A one-time grant available for eligible schools in England to bid for capital funding. This is funding to be used exclusively to create new or expand nursery provision.

Uley and the local surrounding areas have been identified as having a shortfall in childcare places. Sadly, Uley also lost its long-standing playgroup in December 2023. **There is the potential for Uley Primary School to offer childcare places from 2 years old AND to offer before and after school care.** Imagine how wonderful it would be for families and the children to be able to transition in to the local primary school that they are already familiar with. The Early Years provision, will be school-led.

This means that Uley Primary School needs an additional building within the school grounds to accommodate

our pre-school children. We are delighted to report that we have been successful in these bids and have secured a **grant of £150,000** from the government's School Based Nurseries fund. This can be added to another grant we have secured from Gloucestershire's Early Years Entitlement Fund, however this still **leaves us short of £100,000** we need to complete the project.

Housing Committee Meeting

Uley Parish Council attended Stroud District Council's Housing Committee meeting on **9 June** where the proposed redevelopment of **The Knoll** was discussed. We raised residents' continuing concerns about **highway congestion, parking pressure and pedestrian/child safety on South Street**, particularly at school drop-off and pick-up times, as well as wider infrastructure issues. We will share a fuller update with residents once the committee outcomes and next steps have been confirmed.

The Dursley United Charity (DUC)

In 2003 a number of small charities associated with Dursley decided to join together under one trusteeship, and became the Dursley United Charity. There were sixteen, some originating from benefactors centuries ago – and since then two more have joined. The charities all had the common aim of **helping local people who are in need, in the parishes of Cam, Dursley, Stinchcombe, and Uley**. The first trustee representing Uley was Margaret Groom. Currently it is David Lungley. Grants are made in response to nominations from professionals who are aware of 'residents in the area of benefit who are in need, hardship, or distress, and those who need support with their mental health and wellbeing' (quoted from the Charitable objects document).

These can be P3 Social Workers, Head Teachers, and Doctors for example. Grants are also given to help local organisations providing a public benefit; and to applicants 'under the age of 25 years in the area of benefit' seeking help with the costs of higher education.

Last year, an offer of support was made to the **Head of Rednock School** to enable his ambition to free his students from their mobile phones during school hours, which was gratefully accepted. **The DUC has been able to make a grant that will cover most of the cost of the lockable phone-signal-blocking pouches that can enable his mission**, from next September – a timely offer in view of the national focus during this year on mobile phone stresses in young people.

Library Challenge 2026

Gloucestershire Libraries Library Challenge 2026 is nearly here!

The Library Challenge will be running in July and helps children stay connected to reading over the school holidays, when literacy levels can often dip.

The challenge is simple, free and open to all children through their local library. Children sign up, borrow books, complete fun tasks and work towards Bronze, Silver and Gold awards — all designed to keep reading enjoyable and help families visit libraries regularly.

This year's theme is **Tales Through Time**, celebrating history, imagination and discovery. Each library will bring the theme to life in its own way, with eye-catching displays and activities throughout the summer holidays. Library staff will be taking the message into schools with around 100 assemblies planned before summer, alongside online resources and in-library promotion.

But Gloucestershire Libraries are also asking councillors (at all levels) to get behind the campaign: **Please encourage schools in your area to take part, celebrate the value of libraries, and help us raise the profile of reading across Gloucestershire.** Please do get involved on social media too: visit your local library, take a selfie, and share it alongside our campaign content to help spread the message further. A visible show of support from councillors will make a real difference!

Church Letter

Many years ago I listened to a sermon preached by a very wise priest. I forget what the rest of the sermon was about but part of what he said was a quote attributed to St Augustine. He who sings, prays twice. It is difficult to prove exactly what was said but the sentiment behind it is certainly grounded in truth. How we all enjoy singing and how readily the hymns sung when we were at school stay with us. Many of our wedding couples choose hymns they remember from when they were young. It is much easier to remember words when they are set to a tune and so much easier to recall.

At St Giles' we have a great musical tradition. We are fortunate to have a good, regular organist in David Walker. So many churches rely on recorded accompaniments for hymns, so we are very grateful that he plays at services every week and at the many weddings we are lucky enough to have in the benefice.

There are many references in the Bible about singing, notably in the psalms. Here are just two examples.

"Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!" – Psalm 95:2

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs." – Psalm 100:1-2

There is an opportunity to sing some of your favourite hymns in praise of God are coming up next month at Songs of Praise

at St Bartholomew's on Sunday 23rd August to celebrate the patronal festival. Last year the service at St Bartholomew's was held outside accompanied by several members of Thornbury Town Band. What a joyous & memorable occasion. We plan to repeat it this year. Let's hope the weather is kind again.

Music plays a huge part in other aspects of church life. Our regular "Music for a Sunday Afternoon" events have proved popular, with a wide range of performers from contemporary bands through instrumental ensembles to sublime choral singing, not forgetting the talented youngsters who played to help raise money for the well. On Saturday 18th July at 7.30 the cellist Orlando Jopling is coming to play solo cello suites by Bach. What a privilege. These concerts are free as all our performers give of their time and talents without charge with the audience generously donating for the work of the church, for which we are very grateful. I am fortunate in that I have many musical contacts-a legacy of a lifetime of teaching wonderfully talented students who continue to make music. There are now musicians who ask if they can come to perform. They know they will be given a warm welcome in a beautiful church with lovely acoustics-just as you will be when you come to any of our services and musical events.

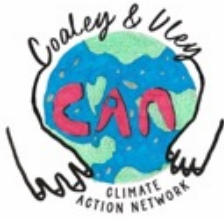

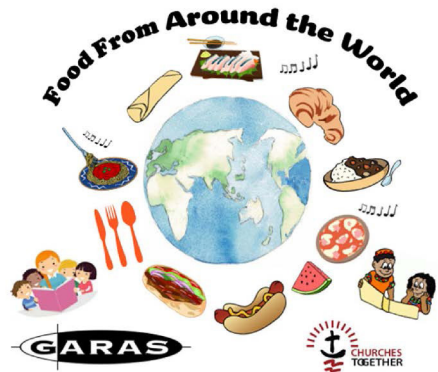

Garden Notes

Let's dig deeper into the wonderful range of Clematis that is available to gardeners now. I've talked previously about pruning groups so now I'll expand on the different groups, flowering times and a few recognised excellent cultivars. There are too many to mention them all but it would be a delightful cornucopia to dive into!

Evergreen Species

Pruning Group 1

Flowering Feb-April

This group requires a warm sheltered spot to perform well. Prune only when necessary.

- C.Armandii 'Apple Blossom'
- C.Armandii 'Snowdrift'
- Clematis cirrhosa, a drought tolerant evergreen. Bell shaped, nodding flowers with full and fluffy seedheads.
- C. Cirrhosa 'Freckles'

Alpina and Macropetala Species

Pruning Group 1

Flowering mid to late Spring

Charming bell shaped and double cultivars. Very hardy in exposed or sheltered gardens with good seed heads.

- C. Alpina 'Frances Ravis', C.'Pamela Jackman'
- C.Macropetala 'Blue Bird' C.'Jan Lindmark'

Montana Hybrids

Pruning Group 1

Flowering late spring to early summer

Known for being rampant growers, these can be kept in check with judicious pruning after flowering, or throw it up a tree!

- C. Montana 'Marjorie', C.Montana var. Rubens

Early large flowered hybrids

Pruning Group 2

Late Spring/ early summer

These cultivars are noted for the range of colours and sheer size of their flowers

- C. 'Marie Boisselot, C.'Fujimusume'

Mid Season and Late Large -

Flowered Hybrid

Pruning Group 3

Flowering on longer stems and into autumn.

- C.'Jackmanii Superba', C.'Ville de Lyon'
- C.'John Huxtable'

NOTE: All large Flowered Cultivars can be prone to Clematis Wilt (a fungal disease often associated with sudden rise in temperature or humidity) causing sudden collapse. Cut back to healthy shoots and if planted well below the ground level, new shoots should appear.

Viticella Species and Hybrids

Pruning Group 3

Flowering mid summer to early autumn

Both Species and hybrids are deciduous, very hardy, full of vigour and floriferous. They flower on current season's growth. Flowers are delicately small and nodding

- C. viticella 'Alba Luxurians',
- C. viticella 'Madame Julia Correvon

Texensis Species

Pruning Group 3

Flowering early summer to early autumn

You'll be familiar with the 'royals'...

- C. Texensis 'Princess Diana',
 - C. Princess Kate
- but don't miss
- C. texensis 'Gravetye Beauty'

Planting Tips

- Buy the largest plant you can afford
- Clematis like a cool root run or need watering well
- Pink/white or light blue show up best in shadier spots
- Autumn planting is best while soil is still warm
- Soak rootball thoroughly before planting
- Ensure top of rootball is at least 6 cm below rim of hole
- Keep canes in situ until established
- Label!!

There really is a clematis for every garden and I'm sure you won't only have one! Happy Gardening

Citizens Advice Column: Worried About Money After Injury?

Q: *I've recently had to give up work due to a back injury, and I'm worried about how I'm going to cope with the drop in income. I'm not sure what benefits I can get - where should I start?*



A: Lots of people miss out on benefits they're **entitled to**, so it's definitely worth checking what you can get. Claiming benefits can also give you **access** to other financial help like cost-of-living payments and discounts on energy and transport.

To get started, you can use an **online benefits calculator**. For the most accurate results, you'll need information about your savings, income, pension, childcare payments and any existing benefits for you and your partner, if you have one. Tools like Entitledto, Policy in Practice or Turn2us can help.

Universal Credit is the main benefit for most working-age people. If your injury makes it difficult to work, you might receive more or not need to look for work. You may also be entitled to other benefits or help with council tax or living costs. If you're unsure, **Citizens Advice** can help.

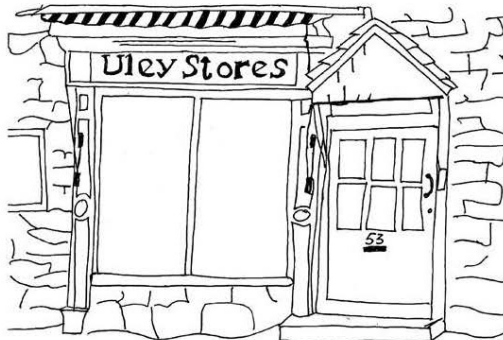
In the Shop

....so your home shopping has arrived and “Quel horreur” it is not what you want. Returns are a pain but made a bit simpler if you request a Royal Mail or DPD return label or QR code. Then you can pop the return into the PO in Uley and not go on the hunt for a locker somewhere.

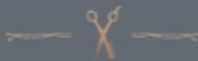
