Many of the village activities rely on the hard work and commitment of volunteers. At the August Parish Council meeting Amanda Voss was thanked for her work as leader of Uley Youth Productions. Her dedication and skills have, for many years, inspired a huge number of young people in Uley to develop and show their creative talents. Thank you Amanda.

Farewell Horse Chestnut

Some people have been asking why the beautiful tree on the Green was felled in July. Sadly, it was seriously diseased, as is the case for many young horse chestnuts, and given its position it was at risk of falling into the road, on cars or people. The whole tree has been very carefully removed, a stump grinder was used to take out much of the root system and the ground has been very tidily restored. There has been talk about possibly replacing it but for now the ground needs to heal and the other trees are enjoying the new space.

The Knoll

The Parish commissioned a road safety report to examine the potential issues raised by the increased number of houses proposed on the Knowle. This report is now available on the Parish Council website and there are hard copies in the village shop. Please do not take

these away. If you really need a hard copy please contact the Clerk on clerk@uleyparishcouncil.gov.uk and we can print a copy off for you.

It was recently reported that the Knoll sign on South Street was deliberately removed. It has been replaced but we ask people not to tamper with or remove signs in the future.

VAS Road Signs

The Vehicle Activated Signs into the village are being repaired and replaced. It has been a lengthy process, but we're assured it will happen soon.

News from the Uley Archives

A couple of volunteers and myself have been working since the beginning of the year to reorganise and digitally catalogue the Uley Archives. The Archives capture the history of Uley and Owlpen: people, properties, places, events and organisations. We are sorting through all the existing material and storing it in suitable archival folders to protect it for the future, and creating a database which helps us to know what is available and where it is stored. The Archives are also now moving into a newly dedicated room within the Village Hall.

There is still much work to do but we wanted to update everyone and ask villagers some questions to help fill some gaps in the collections:

1. Do you have about any specific memories, photographs, documents etc related to how the village was affected by the **COVID 19** pandemic? Copious information related to the national response can be found elsewhere but we have little in the Archives about how Uley and Owlpen managed.
2. Does your house have a name? Has the name changed? We are creating a record of **house names** and linking them to the current house numbers.
3. Do you have any historic photos of **Raglan Way** or **Lampern View**? The Archives have a strong collection of photos of other parts of the village but only one 1950s postcard of Raglan Way and nothing at all showing Lampern View.

If you have information or items that you think would be of interest to the Archives please email us on uley.archives@outlook.com and one of us will get back to you.

We will keep you posted on progress – and no doubt be back with further questions.

From the Churchwardens

Our churches have continued to provide cool spaces over this hot and dry summer and seen many joyous wedding celebrations at St Giles and Holy Cross. We are enjoying receiving wedding couples for the 2027 season at our regular services.

We were very touched in July by the generosity of acclaimed cellist Orlando Joplin who held a concert for us at St Giles performing Bach cello suites to a spellbound audience. Alongside his professional performances he offers his services to local churches for free to help raise valuable funds to maintain and preserve the historic buildings.

Another opportunity to support our buildings is the annual Ride and Stride on Saturday 12th September, we'll have our churches open to welcome walkers, bikers and more, and if you want to do some fundraising do please get involved via <https://ghct.org.uk/ride-and-stride>.

Our thoughts will turn quickly to celebrating the bounty of the earth, even during times of drought, and perhaps more so as we are so aware how much we rely on the goodness of creation to sustain us. The Uley Show in September will be followed by Harvest celebrations in October. We plan to return to St Bartholemew's with a breakfast before the service on October the 4th, and also continue the theme at our Second Sunday service at St Giles.

On the 9th October (Friday) we have secured an Oompah Band to enable us to run an Oktoberfest event to raise funds to refurbish the Price Tomb. The Price family ran the malting and brewing trade during the peak of Uley's woollen mill era in the late 19th Century and built what is now Uley Brewery. Garden Notes

Well that was a helluva summer! Whether you revelled in the sunshine and alfresco dining or, (as gardeners and growers), stared at the endlessly cloudless sky with grim disbelief - climate change plonked itself firmly in our laps this year.

September traditionally walks a subtle line between summer and autumn - memory and momentum... we'll see.

Westonbirt Arboretum

With two years of summer drought, its fair to expect an early autumn show this year. It's easy to forget our National Arboretum sitting quietly nearby. Spectacular glades of acers are a big draw but there is so much more. We're going to join one of the two daily guided walks (11am and 2pm) to help expand our knowledge and enjoyment of this fantastic resource.

Alternatives to a pond

We are lucky to have spring fed ponds (only just this year!) Not everyone can add a pond so lets look at alternatives for any garden. With the ground baked hard, flora and fauna has suffered terribly so nows the time to plan and act to support them next year.

- **Pond in a bucket** - sink a bucket/old sink in the ground making sure to add rocks or ladder for land dwellers to climb out.
- **Bubbler** - put in a bubbler and surround with pebbles. Requires electricity but is a safe, beautiful and wildlife friendly water feature.

- **Bog Garden** - Create similarly to a pond but much shallower
- **Bird Bath** - A shallow dish on the ground which does not dry out or freezes. Birds need to bathe daily for their health. Keep it clean.

With food sources scarce in gardens and farmland alike, think about helping to build up mammals to ensure they survive winter dormancy. In particular hedgehogs of course. Mice and voles have taken full advantage of our fruit cage reminiscent of scenes from Brambly Hedge..apron clad field mice dashing past armed with baskets of juicy berries. Our wild hedgerows may not have such bountiful fruit..so feed your birds please.

Self seeders

I love these generous volunteers - foxgloves, verbenas and hollyhocks. Some can be left in situ for a naturalistic look, others can be either potted up or relocated to a more suitable location to enjoy next year. I plant them in serried ranks in a spare patch in the kitchen garden where they romp away enjoying the good garden soil. I'll plant them around the garden early spring for those fabulous vertical statements.

Church Letter

There are so many ways to start the year... and, with schools and colleges in mind, we're beginning again. Last September at St Giles we held the first Second Sunday Special service and so we return this year for more blessings of new beginnings. In fact, I guess that's what we do week by week as we return for worship. The (very relaxed) Second Sunday Special service on Sunday 13th September will begin with refreshments served from 9.45am and is an opportunity to celebrate together as a community, sing, pray and give thanks - and not simply for any triumphs from the Village Show!

Later in the month (27th September) there will be another special service at St Giles where Bishop Rachel is coming to baptise and confirm several adults in their Christian faith. At this service, promises made at baptism will be affirmed and the bishop will use the words: God has called you by name and made you his own as she places her hands on each person's head and invites the Holy Spirit to confirm them, for who they are and who they are called to become.

*Almighty and ever-living God,
you have given these your servants new birth
in baptism by water and the Spirit,
and have forgiven them all their sins.
Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them:
the Spirit of wisdom and understanding;
the Spirit of counsel and inward strength;*

*the Spirit of knowledge and true godliness;
and let their delight be in the fear of the Lord.*

If you have never been to such a service and are a little curious, you are very welcome.

If you have been baptised or confirmed yourself but have wandered away from a life of faith, hope and love, you are very welcome.

If you're a regular worshipper, you are very welcome.

There is something very special about being part of other people's new beginnings, next steps of faith made and prayed in public. A bit like a wedding service, we are witnessing and celebrating the big YES that contains all the little yes's (and no's) of life.

There are many ways of practicing the Christian faith and at best they help us to grow in faith, hope and love: to develop a deep and life-changing spirituality and to become more Christ-like. Ancient wisdom teaches that faith development is best done in community, which is what we are seeking as we gather for worship week by week. Being baptised or confirmed is about making public the decision to follow Jesus Christ as part of a community of faith. Please pray for all those who are preparing to take this step,

and please know that the invitation to join the journey is for you, whoever you are, whatever you may have done/not done and whatever life may have in store.

Some more words from the end of the service: *You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life.*

I'll say Amen to that!

Citizens Advice Column

Q: I hired a company to install fencing and a gate, but the work is poor quality. What can I do?

If a trader hasn't carried out work with 'reasonable care and skill', the Consumer Rights Act 2015 gives you the right to ask them to fix the problem or provide a refund.

Gather evidence by taking photographs, keeping receipts and making notes about what happened. Then contact the trader and explain the problem. They should put things right within a reasonable time.

If they refuse, you may be able to complain to your card provider (if you paid by card), to a trade association or quality scheme (if the trader is a member), or use an alternative dispute resolution scheme (ADR). If all fails, you may be able to complain to the Financial Ombudsman Service.

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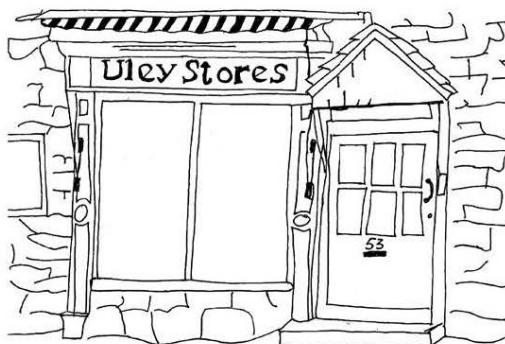
In the Shop

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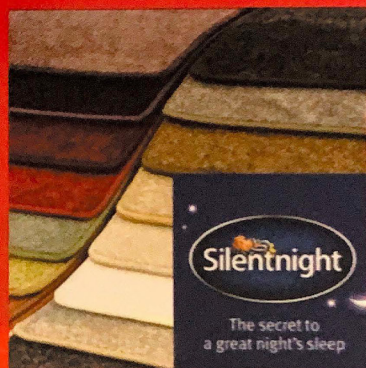
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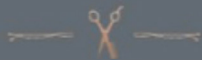
